## Marketing Organics in a Changing World

BOBL will publish a review of consumers' attitudes to organic produce at the Welsh Organic Producers' Conference, 21<sup>st</sup> October at the RWAS, Builth Wells. The review was carried out by Beaufort Research to monitor the current attitudes of consumers to organic produce from Wales. The work will help identify key messages for the BOBL communications campaign, as well as provide useful marketing information for Welsh organic businesses. The review provides an insight into the market for organic products and what has driven its growth over the last ten years. It also identifies reasons behind consumers' current purchasing decisions. The survey looks at the demographics of consumers and their attitudes to related issues, such as animal welfare, the environment and the provenance of food. ## Communications Campaign

StrataMatrix were appointed in July to lead the BOBL Communications work and we're now finalising the direction of the campaign. The campaign will take into account key points identified in the Beaufort Research Consumer Attitudes survey as well as provide Welsh input to the Organic UK campaign. The BOBL Communications campaign strategy will form part of the 'Getting the Message Across' seminar at the Welsh Organic Producer Conference on 21 October.

## Sustainable Food Communities

The Soil Association (SA) has been appointed to develop BOBL's Sustainable Food Communities (SFC) in Wales. The project is modelled on the successful Food for Life Partnership programme in England. BOBL will also support the introduction of the SA Catering Mark into Wales through the SFC programme. The Catering Mark provides a pathway for greater use of local and organic produce in the catering sector.

## Open Organic Farms

The Open Organic Farms programme has started and four school visits have been held in Pembrokeshire. The Open Organic Farms programme will introduce people to organic food and farming through farm walks, on farm events, and farmers' markets held at schools. The programme is an important contributor to the Sustainable Food Communities work.

## Ethical Toolkit

BOBL have been working with The Food Ethics Council to develop an Ethical Toolkit for organic businesses. The toolkit will help organic businesses demonstrate that they're playing their part in promoting a fair and healthy society in addition to the contribution organic farming makes to the environment.

Organic Centre Wales (OCW) has succeeded in securing nearly £2M over three years for work to support the development of organic businesses in Wales.

The project has dedicated staff based at OCW, and uses existing partners, consultancies and businesses to deliver major elements of the project:
